TEXTURE

ART WORDS

- **Texture** is the way something feels or the way something looks like it would feel...if you could touch it. For example, textures can be hard, soft, smooth, rough, bumpy, sticky or slippery.
- **Illusory texture** tricks you into seeing texture in a work of art. For example, an artist might paint an animal's fur and make it look soft, but it's not really fur – it's only the illusion of fur.
- **Real texture** is not an illusion; it is created by the materials in the art. For example, if an artist uses beads, they will look bumpy. If you were allowed to touch the beads, they would feel bumpy too.

OBSERVATIONS

What **textures** can you find in the art? Make a list. Which ones are **real** and which ones are **illusory**?

How did the artist make those **textures**? What materials did the artist use? For example, did the artist use paint, stone, glass, wood, fabric, metal, paper or something else?
