## LINES

### ART WORDS

- **Lines** are everywhere in art. **Directional lines** pull your attention along a path. They create **movement** and may lead you to look at key parts of the art.
- Some art has a **horizon line**, which is a line where the sky and the earth appear to meet.
- A **vanishing point** is a spot on the horizon where receding lines seem to converge and disappear.
- Some art shows **linear perspective**, which is a drawing technique that creates the illusion of depth and makes a picture look three-dimensional. In linear perspective, receding lines converge at a vanishing point on the horizon.

### OBSERVATIONS

Can you find an example of a **directional line** that pulls your attention along a path in the art? Draw a **line** that matches the movement of your attention.

Close your eyes. Open your eyes. Which part of the art do you notice first? Make a sketch of that area. Is there a connection between the **lines** in the art and where your attention goes?



Choose one work of art from today's virtual session. What choices has the artist made in terms of **perspective**? How does that affect your experience with the art?

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
