

# SHAPE

### ART WORDS

- **Circle** - a perfectly round shape where the curve is always the same distance from the centre point.
- **Triangle** - a shape with three sides and three angles.
- **Square** - a shape with four equal sides, four corners and four right angles.
- **Geometric Shapes** - math-based shapes include squares, circles and rectangles.
- **Organic Shapes** - irregular shapes found in nature such as leaves, and clouds.
- **Symmetrical Shapes** - shapes are the same on both sides of an imaginary line drawn down the middle.
- **Asymmetrical Shapes** - shapes that can not be divided into identical parts by a central dividing line.

### OBSERVATIONS

Shapes are the building blocks of art! What shapes do you see in the artwork? Can you find **geometric shapes** like squares, circles or rectangles? Draw some of the **geometric shapes** you see in the artwork in the boxes below:
