## MATERIALS LIST

Items in bold are required for the first class.
Acrylic paints (brand of your choice, one tube of each colour, approximately $120 \mathrm{ml} / 5 \mathrm{oz}$ :

- ultramarine blue
- phthalo blue
- red (alizarin crimson)
- primary yellow
- hookers green
- raw umber
- burnt sienna
- dioxazine purple
- black
- titanium white (larger tube - we tend to use a lot of white)
- Acrylic matte medium (not gel) 250 ml


## Brushes and Other Materials:

- A large flat 2 inch chip/utility/house natural fiber painters brush (hardware store, home reno big box store can be a good resource.)
- 3 medium sized filbert brushes ( $1 / 4,1 / 2$ and $3 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ hog/natural bristle)
- 1 or 2 palette knives metal or nylon (not plastic).
- a few Palettes: foam or plastic plates (with a rim to hold a wash) White is ideal.
- some Pencil Crayons 4 or 5, various colours light to dark
- Masking tape, scissors


## Surfaces:

- $9 \times 12$ " ring bound hard cover sketchbook, invisible scotch tape.
(Dollarama has inexpensive studio brand)
- 4 canvas boards $16 \times 20$ " (approx.)
- $18 \times 24$ " pad of bond paper (no backing board, cheaper variety (under $\$ 10$ approx.), cartridge paper could be substituted)


## OPTIONAL MATERIALS

- camera phone or ipad
- painting rag: cotton cloth, an old shirt
- scrap paper or newspaper.
- Water spritzer
- other alternative colours like fluorescents or other favourites
- Painting smock
