Class 1: Introduction to Materials

- Will meet students in the common area near the library and then move onto to
- the Henry Moore Sculpture Centre.
- Through a series of exercises, students will learn how line describes contour,
- · edges, mass, depth and volume

Class 2: Colour

- Will meet students in the common area near the library and then move onto the
- · Canadian galleries, then to Pacita Abad exhibit
- Students will learn gradating, layering, blending, hatching, stippling and
- burnishing

Class 3: Composition through Landscape

 Will meet students in the common area near the library and then move onto to the Canadian Galleries (JW Morrice and Tom Thomson), where participants will learn about planning the composition, the importance of the horizon, the balance of tones, gradients and highlights

Class 4: Portraiture

- Will meet students in the common area near the library and then move onto to the
- portrait gallery in the European Collection.
- Students will learn the importance of proportions and the relationship between facial
- · features to create a realistic likeness
